We have been so proud to represent Triangle's values on campus and beyond. We were thrilled to welcome 27 new brothers this academic year. With an active chapter reaching just over 60, we have been growing rapidly and have no intention of slowing down anytime soon.

Our brothers have worked very hard to recruit and retain members of the highest quality. Spring semester we had a record breaking pledge class of 19 new members, all of whom reciprocated our passion for STEM and Triangle. Scholarship has always been a top priority of Triangle, and our members demonstrated that with an average GPA of 3.41 and 3.46 in the fall and spring semesters, respectively. Additionally, nine brothers achieved a perfect 4.0 GPA. Spring semester our brothers' honest effort paid off as our chapter had the highest GPA of any IFC organization. We couldn't be prouder of the hard work our men have put in over the past year.

Leadership has always been an area where Triangles continue to excel, and this year was no different. Our brothers continue to be involved across campus in a variety of organizations, ranging from Boxing Club to Engineering E-Council. Over 75% of our brothers hold leadership positions in one organization or another. Beyond that, this year two of our brothers were recognized for their leadership. Out of Columbus:

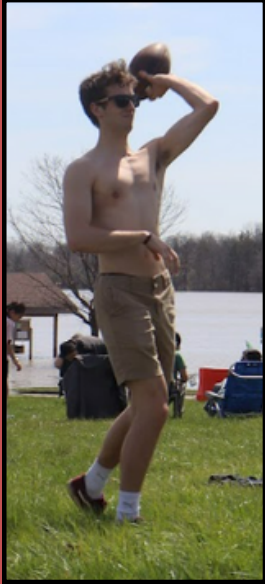

BS in Computer Science and Engineering

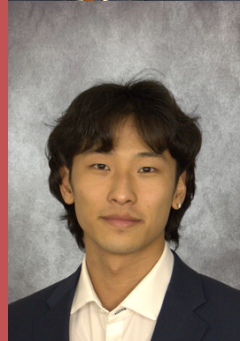
Steven will be staying in Columbus for another year to complete his Masters in Computer Science and Engineering
